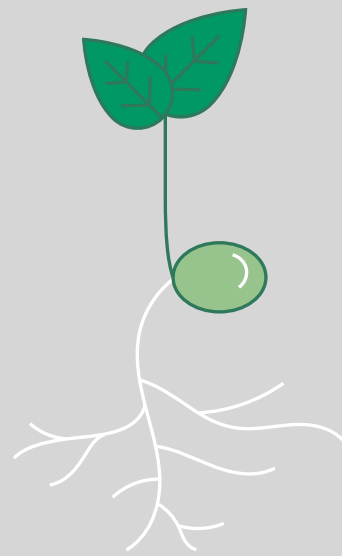

As we reflect on our 2019 fiscal year, we must celebrate our donors, partners, and community members who believe in the power of quality education and mentorship. You have impacted youth across our city by providing them the tools to thrive. We are humbled by your passion and commitment. Thank you!

Student Sponsor Partners' programs have grown and evolved to create opportunity for thousands of deserving youth over the years. We graduate students at a far higher rate than those of similar demographics at public high schools. In fact, 82 percent of our Class of 2019 graduated high school on time and 99 percent received college acceptances.

These outcomes are translated into impact through the successes of our alumni. More than half of our most recent graduates who attended college earned degrees in six years or less. That is nearly four times the national average for low-income students. We have seen our alumni branch out and make a difference in their communities.

This past year, we focused on strategic partnerships and adapted to the changing needs of our students. We hosted our most successful Founder's Dinner, co-chaired by

longtime supporters Dee and Kevin Conway and Susan and Jimmy Dunne. This annual fundraising event allowed us the opportunity to honor our nearly 200 New York Police Department mentors with the help of guest speaker Larry Fitzgerald of the Arizona Cardinals. We're grateful to all involved and to the dozens of attendees who decided to fund scholarships and education programs for our students that night.

These are just highlights of the progress you helped us achieve. Throughout this annual report, you will see the numbers and stories behind them. But none of this – our longevity, our programs, our impact – would be possible without your support.

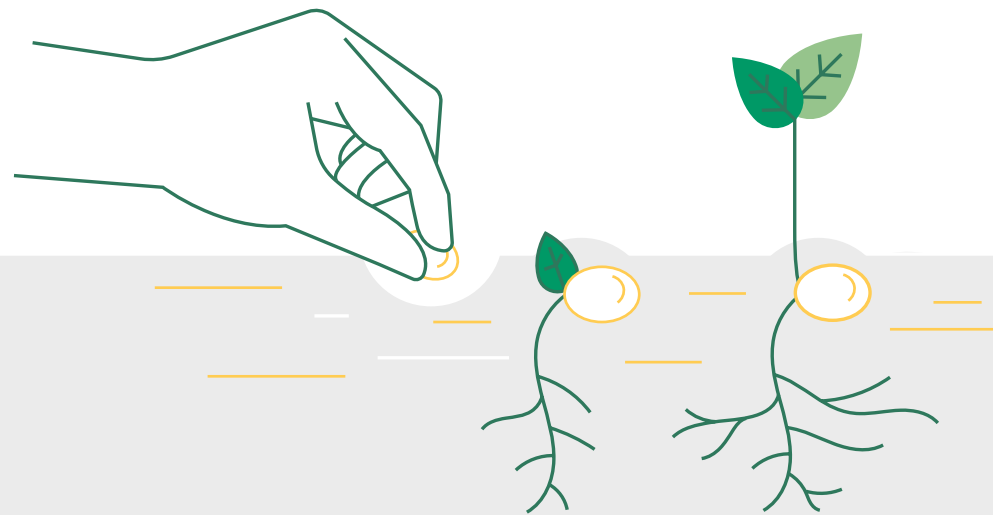

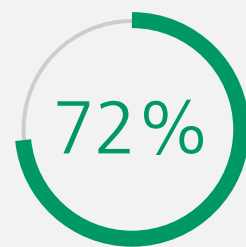


Many of our students are the first in their families to attend college. We help them navigate the college process by offering SAT prep courses, college advising, financial aid application support, and essay and interview workshops.

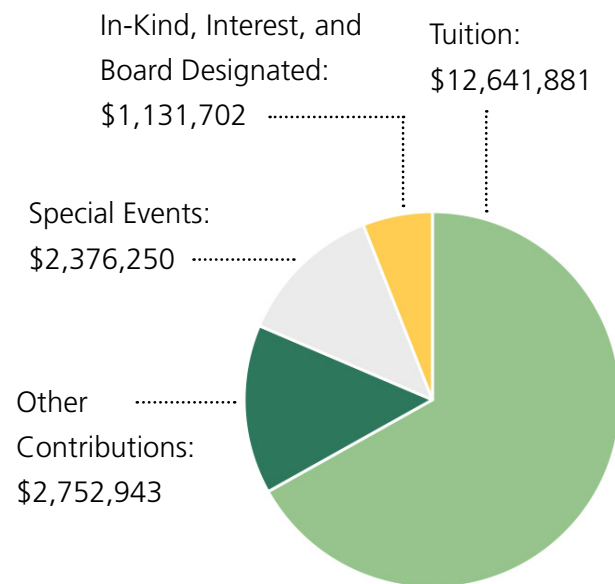

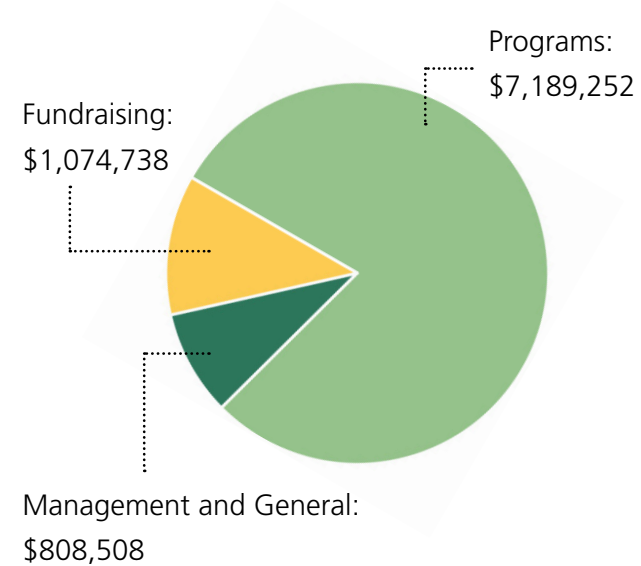
